Calling from London to U.S.

Using British prepaid calling cards: Prepaid calling cards usable in the United Kingdom can be bought from news agents.

British calling cards are similar to prepaid calling cards in the United States. You dial a free 0800 access number, then the PIN of the prepaid calling card, and then the number you are calling. It may be used from any telephone, both to make calls within London and to call back to the U.S..

Dialing the U.S. using a prepaid card

If you were calling the University of Delaware operator, (302) 831-2000, for example, using a British prepaid calling card, you would first dial the 0800 number on the card, then your PIN, and then:

dial the UK's international access code, 00

then the country code for the USA, 1 then the area code, 302 for Newark then the telephone number, 831-2000 The result would be: 00 + 1 + 302 + 831-2000 for UD information.

Calling within London

Dial the number WITH the 0. Worth double checking if this is exactly right. It might be different from a cell phone versus a land line. You should try this between the flats and Bill when you first get to the flats. Bill will have his cell phone with him.

Everyone with a cell phone should be sure to put Bill's phone numbers into them and call him once early in your trip to make sure it is correct.

Illness

Chemists (Pharmacists) can recommend nonprescription medication for minor illnesses. The largest chain is called Boots. The local police station has a list of chemists that are open late or 24 hours a day. Moving around

The London Tube System is a great mass transit system.

Everyone will receive an Underground Tube / Bus Pass which is good for travel over all of central London. Protect that pass. You are responsible if you lose it and they aren't cheap to replace.

You should quickly learn how to read the directions on both the Underground and buses at the various stops.

A good way to try out the buses is take a couple of hours and ride for a while, get off and ride a different bus, and just see where you go. Once you get the hang of it, it is quite easy.

ETIQUETTE ISSUES FOR OUR VISITS

NEVER GO INTO THE BUILDING OR INTO A MEETING WITHOUT A FACULTY MEMBER PRESENT.

When we gather for a visit always wait outside the building or just inside if it is raining. Given the number of us, avoid blocking the sidewalk.

You should always give the appearance of intense interest in the discussion. Look directly at people when they are talking to us. You should always have something to take notes on while we are engaged with visits.

S good day to queue for Wimbledon.

If you think you might do this you should read the Wimbledon website thoroughly as rules can change from one year to the next. This should get you to the rules.

Generally, these are the rules and suggestions. This Sunday is called the "Player's Sunday" and generally there are no matches scheduled unless the weather has been poor and they have matches to make up. Center Court now has a roof which helps a lot. The idea is that you queue up today and watch tomorrow. So, here is the explanation.

You must queue as a group as Wimbledon is very careful and strict to protect everyone's position in the queue. It is good to be AT THE QUEUE by 1:00 pm on Sunday at least which will guarantee you early access to tickets.

Prices for 2015 are £98 for Centre Court, £75 for Court 1, and £64 for Court 2.

AND THEY ONLY TAKE CASH.

This is a guide to the order of events from starting to queue overnight to actually gaining entry into the grounds:

It is amazing to think that you can queue up for tickets to Centre Court for the biggest tennis tournament in the world and be sitting right on the court. This will make you feel good about the British. You'll also meet some incredible

people both watching out for your safety as well as queuing up with you. Have something to keep track of email addresses. There are people that queue every day except the for the last four days (semi-finals and finals). One year when a large group of us queued up the group that was immediately behind us was the group immediately in front of us the next year.

IF YOU GO YOU NEED TO BE PREPARED THAT IT MIGHT RAIN, SO GO TOGETHER AND BUY A TARP TO KEEP THE RAIN OFF YOU AND THINNER PLASTIC TO KEEP YOU OFF WET GROUND. You can store all of your bedding which es explained later.

Join the queue on Church Road at either the North (towards Southfields) or West (towards Wimbledon Village). Entrance into the grounds from both queues is eventually via Gate 3. An equal number of tickets is allocated to each queue, so it's just down to personal preference or convenience as to which one you choose. See our Wimbledon Street Map page (britishtennis.com/tickets/wmap.shtml) for exact queue positioning points.

Upon joining the queue you will be given a numbered Queue Card by one of the Honorary Stewards.

If camping for tickets for the first or second Monday of the tournament you can set up your tent straight away. For any other day you can still queue, but you cannot immediately put up tents. The reason being that they block the pavement which is still a public right of way. You are required to wait until one hour after the last match of the day has finished at Wimbledon (9.30 pm is not uncommon therefore 10.30 pm) before the Stewards will let you take over the pavement. Ironically you can be queuing for "tomorrow", while people right next to you are queuing for "today" to catch some late evening tennis!

So you have now set up your tent and gotten comfortable.

There are a number of dedicated toilet / wash room facilities in the vicinity.

No real need to set an alarm clock in the morning as you will be promptly awakened at 6.30am by an Honorary Steward! Be warned that it is often cold in the mornings. You will now have about 30 minutes in which to pack your belongings as the queue will move up at 7am. You can check your

excess luggage into the nearest **Left Luggage** facility and return to your position in the queue - you can do this before or after the queue starts to move.

The queue will now be moving forward and you will bunch up and realize you're much closer to the front than you thought you were! One of the early years of VCUK we were 3rd in line for CENTRE COURT. Now prepare to wait around 3 hours until 10am for the "holding area" to open not particularly nice if it's raining, I can tell you.

Depending on how far up the queue you are, you may have a choice of showcourt tickets (Centre, No. 1, No. 2) which is why you want to queue up as early on Sunday as you can at least by 1:00 pm). There are TVs around or you can purchase a newspaper which will show you which matches are on which courts on Monday, so you will know in advance who is scheduled on each court. You will know if any of these tickets (typically about 3,000 each day to start) are available before entering the grounds, an Honorary Steward will ask you which court you would like a ticket for, and then issue you with an associated wrist band. This band is then your key to obtaining the showcourt ticket once you reach the turnstiles. Without a wristband of any kind you will only gain a Ground Pass admission at the turnstiles.

BUY YOUR TICKET! IMPORTANT - ONLY CASH IS ACCEPTED, NO CHEQUES OR CREDIT CARDS!

The tickets you will have a choice of tend to be very, very, very, very close to the grass. You can hear the players breathing.

Find a layout of Wimbledon show courts. On Center Court the side to the left when you are looking toward the Royal Box is opposite the Chair Umpire, so your view is unobstructed, but then you aren't quite as close to the players between games. The section that is looking up the baseline on the other side (Section 101) is where the players exit so it is the best place to try and get an autograph by the match winner. Have something to sign and have a pen for them to sign it. On Court 1, sections 8 & 10 are the likely ones for tickets that are opposite the Chair Umpire.

Every time you travel you should "Go somewhere there." This is most definitely one of those places.
